## January Worship Schedule

**Sunday, January 1<sup>st</sup>—New Year's Day: One service only, 10:00 a.m.!!!**  
Join us on this Epiphany Sunday in **Fellowship Hall for Family Worship** led by our children and youth. Please bring Christmas cookies or other sweets to share for a continental breakfast.

**Sunday, January 8<sup>th</sup>:** Today we return to our normal worship schedule and begin a new sermon series on "Conversations in Faith." How do we talk about our faith in ways that help us make sense of life issues and concerns? In a message based on Genesis 1:1-5 and titled "And God Said..." we will consider what it means to say that God created the world and all that is in it.

**Sunday, January 15<sup>th</sup>:** Today's message in our series on "Conversations in Faith" is based on the Old Testament story of Samuel's calling (1 Samuel 3:1-10). In "God Calls," we will consider how God calls each one of us to a life of faithfulness, no matter what our age or stage of life. At 10:00 a.m. **the children and youth will present the musical "No Wonder,"** and at the 10:45 service, we will celebrate the **sacrament of baptism.**

**Sunday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>—**We continue our series on "Conversations in Faith" with a look at the story of Jonah and the repentance God worked in the hearts of the Ninevites. "Turning Toward God," based on Jonah 3:1-5, 10, will help us to see how we can open our own hearts to God's love.

**Sunday, January 29<sup>th</sup>—** Deuteronomy 18:15-20 speaks of God's prophets. In this season of political debates and primaries, there are people on all sides of the issues claiming to speak the truth of God. This morning in a message called "Discerning God's Voice," we consider how faith helps us to discriminate among competing claims of politicians and cultural forces.

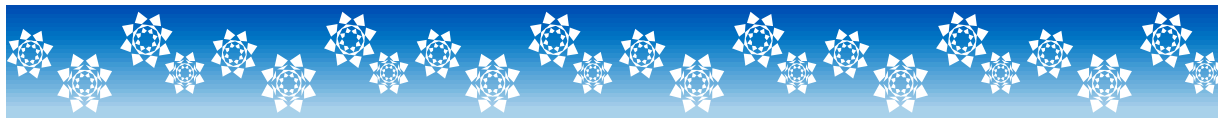

## *From the Pastor...*

### **SEASON OF CHANGE**

It's a new year, symbolic of a fresh start. And how many of us see it as a time for change—a time for changing our eating or exercising habits, a time for changing the way we treat family members, a time for changing our habits of prayer and church-going. That's what New Year's resolutions are about, after all—changing the things about our lives or ourselves that we don't like. And by saying that, we are acknowledging that change can be a good thing.

Think of all the changes you've been through in your life: going away to college; getting married; having children; watching the children grow up and leave home; retiring. Change is an inevitable part of life. But we have a love/hate relationship with change: change can be exciting and hopeful, but it also means loss and uncertainty. We've lost the familiar and comfortable, and we're afraid of that uncertainty. (I'm reminded of the light bulb joke: How many country and western singers does it take to change a light bulb? Five ... one to change the light bulb and a quartet to sing about how much they long and pine for the old one.) We like to know in advance what any change is going to look like and what it's going to require of us. But the problem with that, from a Christian perspective, is that it requires no faith. And the Bible tells us in 2 Corinthians 5:7 to "live by faith, not by sight."

We like to live by sight, don't we? We want to know that everything will turn out just like we want it to. The fact of the matter is that we don't really trust God to take care of things for our best interest. But for us to grow in our relationship with God, for us to grow in our faith, we need to learn to walk by faith and not by sight. And that requires that we move forward in the midst of change and uncertainty.



So what are the challenges and changes you are facing in the new year? Maybe your family is going through a time of change, or your job is changing. Maybe you face the challenge of rebuilding a marriage or moving to a retirement community or learning to live with a chronic health concern. Our challenge at First Church is to continue to grow our vital programs of Christian Education and youth ministry, outreach to homebound members, music and mission, while working with a reduced budget; and to prepare for a smooth transition to a new senior pastor. It will require your patience and flexibility, the commitment of your heart, your time and your talents. But I believe that God is always at work, no matter what the changes in our lives, and trusting God through the changes can help us to grow closer to God. Remember these words from Romans: "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" (8:28 NIV).

I close with this benediction from Ephesians: "Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen" (3:20).

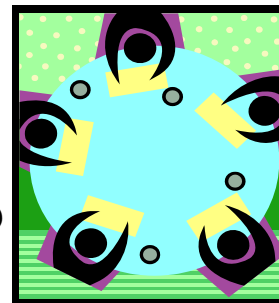
## MEN'S BREAKFAST

## Christian Education News

“*Sunday Morning Groups*” offer classes for all age levels. We welcome new people in all our groups and hope you will consider participating. These Sunday morning groups provide learning, fellowship and a place to connect with others. **All Sunday Morning Groups meet promptly at 9:30 AM**

Nursery 3’s and 4’s and Kindergarten: Preschool and Kindergarten friends will begin 2012 with stories of Jesus’ life including Jesus at the Temple, Jesus Is Baptized, and The Fishermen.

Grades 1-4: Elementary children will be “Getting to Know God” with new large group/small group lessons. Grades 1-4 begin the morning in Fellowship Hall at 9:30 AM. Following the opening activities children will move to their respective classrooms for small group discussions and activities. ***Parents will pick up students in their homerooms. Grades 1-2 are in Room 7 and grades 3-4 are in room 12.***

### Middle School Youth

- 5-6 Graders will be “Grappling with these questions *Why Are My Friends So Mean Sometimes?, Did God Really Write the Bible?, Did God Really Write the Bible?, How Is the Bible Different From Other Books?*”
- 7-8 Graders will study stories of Jesus ministry and those with whom Jesus interacted to gain insight into God’s kingdom here on earth.

Senior High Youth: Mrs. Arp and Mrs. Tyler will continue to research topics of interest with this group.

### Adult Groups

- The Conversation Class will examine aspects of the New Testament in a DVD based study. This group meets in the Lounge.

## *From the Pastor of Christian Education*

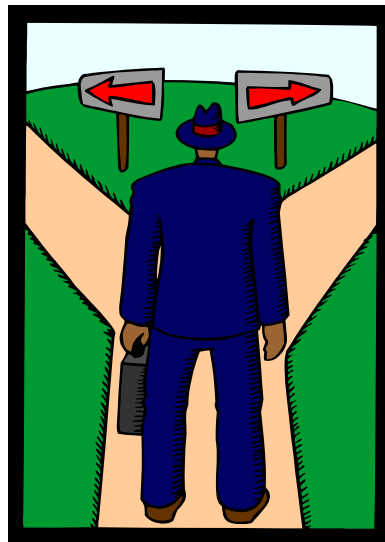
